2. Secretary's Report

- Paul O'Grady provided an update on MNF membership. There are currently 634 members of the MNF, split relatively evenly between residents and workers.
- Belinda Harley has been appointed as Resident Director by Steering Group which will need to be endorsed by the Forum at the next AGM.

3. Treasurer's Report

- Charles Owen updated on MNF Bank accounts which holds just over £21,000, some of which is allocated to CIL funding projects including Green Mayfair and Alford Street Gardens

4. Planning & Public Realm Report

- Gordon Morrison updated the MNF on Planning & Public Realm Report on behalf of Nigel Hughes.

5. Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy Report

- Belinda Harley updated on Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy.
 - Aldford Street Garden's priority is to improve the cleanliness and safety.
 - Green Mayfair to replace Mayfair Green routes.
 - Mayfair Library to be investigated as CIL project.

6. Park Lane (NCIL update)

- MNF have committed to spend £75,000 of CIL on traffic study for Park Lane improvement but wait WCC approval.

7. Shepherd's Market (NCIL update)

- Support of CIL offered and registered with Westminster City Council.

8. Tyburn Route

- Paul O'Grady will share the outcomes of the South Molton Triangle River Tyburn consultation with MNF.
- Engagement encouraged with other areas the River Tyburn flows through for coordinated approach.

9. Unsociable Behaviour & Rough Sleeping Report

- MNF researching the ways to support homelessness in Mayfair. MNF have engaged with Centre for Homelessness Impact who have given initial reports to MNF detailing routes that can be undertaken to improve homelessness.

10. Mayfair Neighbourhood Forum Renewal

- MNF members are invited to write letters of support to MNF renewal.

11. AOB

- Three Kings Yard disturbance to be investigated.
- Concerns over two parking space and additional construction on Carrington Street. Gordon Morrison to bring to Edward Watts attention.
- Mount Street Gardens anti-social behaviour within gardens. If there is an emergency, report to the police via 999, otherwise be reported to the police via the online reporting platform or 101.
- Acoustic cameras to be investigated to address car noise.
