Update on Shepherds Market public realm

Cynthia Grant provided an update on the Shepherds Market public realm scheme. Overall the scheme has received positive support from WCC. The scheme is looking to get MNF financial support (NCIL funding) and support through the consultation phase. The scheme was positively received by the MNF steering group, who agreed that they would consider financial support as part of prioritising CIL projects.



Green Park and Piccadilly gateway public realm scheme

Dan Johnson and Tom Greenhill presented the proposed public realm scheme and the associated safety, greening and cultural benefits that the changes would bring to the area. The scheme was positively received by the MNF steering group.

Planning and Public Realm committee

Nigel provided the update.

- A WCC Planning Officer has recommended delaying any approach for CIL funding of a Conservation Audit to Q2 of 2023
- A number of presentations have been reviewed by the sub-committee in the last month, including proposed changes to the Dorchester hotel

CIL committee

Eric provided the update on the CIL committee:

- Green Route design is progressing and is estimated to be 18 months away from starting construction
- Reverse vending machine are still finalising agreement with British Land for installation in West One
- CCTV contract signed and moving into implementation stage
- Engaging with Peabody on potential CIL projects, with their priorities being greening and security

Edward provided the update on the Comms committee:
